Summer School:

Summer School classes will be offered to 9th and 10th Graders as a priority for groups that do not pass a core class. Summer School registration will be ongoing. All students must register to be considered. Classes offered in Summer School will be Math, English, Science, and Social Studies. All courses will be online.

Senior Potential Failure List (Second Submission) Correction:

Teachers will provide names of any seniors earning an F or has a low percentage, that may cause them to potentially fail. Teachers will not be able to add seniors to the Potential Failure list after Wednesday, May 23, 2018. This does not apply to any Credit Recovery classes.

Any student that was enrolled in Credit Recovery and Credit Recovery Bootcamp must complete the required course.

Credit Recovery Bootcamp (Update):

Students registered in any Extended Day School class will report to their Credit Recovery teachers 3:00 p.m. – 4:30 p.m., Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday. Your teachers will provide details regarding completing online work through Plato. Last day to complete coursework is Thursday, May 31, 2018. Grades will be posted on Friday, June 1, 2018.

Students completing credits through Bootcamp must have all work completed by Friday, June 1, 2018. No Exceptions!!

Course Request for 2018-2019 School Year (Rescheduled):

Students will begin course request for next school year on Friday, June 1, 2018. Counselors will provide more details.

Prom Attire Approval:
